Pre-meeting Assignment: Towards Bronze, Silver, and Gold Criteria for Policy on Active Citizenship

Objective

In Izmir, we will jointly establish the bronze, silver, and gold criteria for school policy on active citizenship education. To prepare, each partner is asked to reflect, analyse, and bring concrete input that will directly feed into the co-creative process.

Step 1: Reflection (All Partners)

Think of your own context (school or university) and answer the following question:

• What does good school policy on active citizenship look like at the most basic level, at a more advanced level, and at an exemplary/innovative level?

Step 2: Assignment for Secondary Schools

- 1. Choose **two areas of policy or practice** related to active citizenship (e.g., student voice, community engagement, democratic culture, inclusion and diversity, global citizenship).
- 2. For each area, describe what the minimum/basic implementation (bronze), the well-developed implementation (silver), and the exemplary/innovative implementation (gold) would look like.
- 3. Summarise your ideas in a matrix (max. 2 pages).

Bring to Izmir:

- A printed copy of your matrix (at least 5 copies).
- Be ready to share and discuss in mixed groups.

Step 2: Assignment for Universities (HEIs)

- 1. Identify **one research-based insight or international best practice** on active citizenship in schools.
- 2. Translate this insight into a **bronze-silver-gold model** for school policy.
 - o Bronze: minimal/basic use of the insight in policy.
 - Silver: stronger, more structured application.
 - o Gold: exemplary, research-informed implementation.
- 3. Summarise in a short handout (1 page).

- 15 printed copies of your handout.
- Be ready to share and connect research to school practice
